Minutes of the **Annual Parish Meeting** of Barnetby-Le-Wold held on **Monday 15th May 2013**
in St.Barnabas Church Hall at 7:15

Present: Cllr Phil Asquith – Chairman

In attendance: Clerk Mrs Julie Reed and 23 members of the public and Rob Beales from N.L. Council.

1. Apologies: Ward Cllrs C Sherwood, N Sherwood and R. Waltham as they are attending meetings at Brigg. Noted that Tony Lawson MBE and Mick Wilson felt their non-attendance was disappointing
2. Chair's Report was read out and is attached
3. Barnetby Recreation Field Group requested their report to be read out by the chair as they were unable to attend. Cllr Asquith read the report attached
4. Chris Spencer expressed his disappointment that the Annual Parish Meeting was not as it was last year whereby all community groups and local police were invited. The Chair explained that this year with the resignation of the clerk, the temporary appointment of the interim clerk and the final appointment of the new clerk it was not possible to arrange such an event in time for the required legal deadlines on holding the annual meeting. The Chair advised that he will call a meeting later in the year the same format as last year's to give residents and groups the opportunity to make presentations. Additionally this meeting was advertised in the town notice-board and anyone wishing to speak has the opportunity now. **Resolved:** Clerk to add Town meeting to next Parish council agenda
5. David Wells advised that the Emerson Trust which has run for a number of years offering education sponsorship has now ceased as all monies have been spent and the account is closed.
6. Tony Lawson advised that St Barnabas and St Helena's Schools merging as a federation has been done successfully this year.

7. A member of the public asked about plans for the Deborah site has there been any enquiries for planning permission.
8. Public raised enquiries regarding “pumping site” for Keigar Estate, will Woodland View have it and what are the options to alleviate flooding will it be linked to Skeggar Beck. Has the full extent of intended clearance of Skeggar Beck been done. Rob Beales responded to the public that Skeggar Beck clearance work is now complete and that plans for a pumping site are being considered and will be subject to N L Planning undertaking necessary public consultation. Helen Munn advised that Silver Street beck is full of rubbish and photographs of the area were circulated. A resident advised that where clearance work had been done the rubbish was piled on the embankments and youths were seen hurling this rubbish back into the beck surely this should have been removed from the site. Tony Lawson asked are Woodland View to get new sewerage pipes, Rob Beales responded he was unaware of the matter. Are road sweepers adding to the problems by distributing the dirt into the sumps. There is a bridge that needs repair on a resident’s property as brickwork was damaged by NLC when clearing the beck. Maria Monks raised the matter that Keigar houses have been built on a dry riverbed and if further planning permission is approved at Deborah’s Yard then it will increase problems. How will Kettleby Quarry extension affect the flood issues, Rob Beale responded that a full geological survey has been done and submitted to planning. Rob Beale has taken away all comments raised and will attend a parish council meeting in the next 2 to 3 months to give further updates.
9. There being no other business the meeting was duly closed at 7:45pm
