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Minutes of the Monthly **Parish Meeting** of Barnetby-Le-Wold held on **Monday 19^h May 2014** in St Barnabas Church Hall at 7:30

In attendance: Clerk Mrs Julie Reed, 7 members of the public and 3 ward councillors.

Public Participation:

Lynne Clarke spoke on behalf of the Village Hall Committee and requested that the plans for the extension be put in the name of the Parish Council as this will reduce the cost by 50% and the PC is the landowner. Agreed to add this to the next agenda. Charities commission will also need notification of the changes.

Wendy Broughton spoke on Skeggar Beck advising of further discharges into the beck and also that the pumping station at Railway Street is not fully operational. 9 discharges since Feb 2012 of which 4 are in the first 5 months of this year. Clerk requested to chase NLC for responses from earlier complaints clerk also advised that elsewhere there had been a forum created to include all parties which worked well.

Vic Bowness asked if we are willing to advertise Lincs Rural Housing on the website would we also advertise his property rentals.

MIN/2013/0529 Breedon Quarry – **Granted**

PA/2014/0430 & PA/2014/0239 The Old Mill change of use and listed building. Cllr Lawson left the meeting for this item only. Motion to SUPPORT Carried.

PA2014/0449 – Erect a dwelling on Carramore Church Hill – resubmission. Motion to OBJECT carried based on safe access and egress on driveway.

PA2013/1625 – Erect a garage at 63 St Barnabas Road- Motion to OBJECT carried based on poor visibility and close proximity to school traffic safety zone.

PA2014/0413 – Erect a dormer bungalow adjacent to 5 Marsh Lane Motion to NO OBJECTION carried provided any and all parts of the building are within the 2003 adopted plan and no tree protection orders present and that all trees should be retained to maintain the character of the site.

9. Ward Councillor's report.

Cllr R Waltham: Hillside crescent tree now cut back on pathway. Viking Way grass cut at the top. Railways Street pothole will be dealt with in the next 2 weeks along with a couple of other flaws noted following Ward Cllrs inspection today. Flood alleviation scheme is still being hampered by uncooperative landowner but the money is secured for the project and ring-fenced. Award has been given to the Village Hall for £13,360 to skim the outside of the building. Skeggar beck previously discussed at public forum and Cllr Waltham suggested we form a Forum to ask questions of all parties.

Cllr N Sherwood: Cllr Bowness asked why we are spending monies on recycling centre and Cllr Sherwood advised that all NLC centres are being upgraded and some will need more work than others it was a generic statement. CCTV, new fencing, re-tarmacing, and signage will be replaced where necessary. Council advised that Cycle route 1 signage has been removed and the one at Church Hill miss-directs, Cllr Sherwood agreed to look into this. Melton Ross Rail Bridge works has experienced problems and delays due to problems with utilities (BT). Cllr Monks advised cycle route from Barnetby to Wrawby needs clearing. NLC Mayor elected for this year is Cllr Trevor Foster and the Deputy Mayor is Cllr Helen Rawson.
