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Minutes of the Monthly **Parish Meeting** of Barnetby-Le-Wold held on **Monday 21st Sept 2015** in Barnetby Village Hall at 7:15

Public Forum:

P Foster spoke against the planning application **PA2015/1136** Erect 4 dwellings 11 Queens Road Barnetby due to personal concerns regarding flooding and subsidence. Much conversation followed and it was decided to make the following **RESOLUTION to OBJECT** on the grounds of drainage and sewerage, generation of traffic, and safe access and egress, landscaping, loss of trees, perceived property loss and representations to the Parish.

Rita Agnew from U5s requested an update on the recreation field development, clerk explained that we have been working with North Lincs planning and environmental officers to redesign and alter the layout of the scheme to mitigate noise to neighbours. The clerk is expecting a response in the next week.

Regarding funding the Parish has set aside £40,000 towards it which shows a strong commitment to the scheme and desire to deliver it as soon as possible as previously advised the Older/Adult area will be done first along with improvements to the car-park. The monies from the PC have been awarded to the car-park because there is not an alternative funding avenue for that element.

Lee Fielden from Barnetby Utd updated on the pavilion which is now fully open and in use and is receiving very complimentary comments from visiting clubs. The toilets cannot be open for public use until we have a person to open and close and clean them. They are opening them on a weekend when they are playing football.

3. **Ward update: Cllr N Sherwood** – Drainage issues now in the hands of the legal dept. for Woodland View.
Cllr R Waltham – Meeting closed from 7:45 to 7:48 to allow a resident complaint on recycling centre. Cllr Waltham gave an update, NLC are looking at alternatives to the current policy which is residents can tip up to 12 per year for garden waste. There is a permit scheme in place at the minute and cabinet are discussing alternatives to ensure genuine household waste can be tipped as oppose to all waste which would include commercial waste. Cllr Wilson asked for updates on Vehicle recognition cameras at the tip can't they be used to sift out the commercial tippers. Also The top of King's Road – when is the scheme likely to start? And also Melton Ross Bridge. The fencing that was promised painting some months ago has not been done on Railway Street. Barnetby Community Club grant approved this week by NLC. Speeding

on Silver Street assessed and it was between 16.8mph and 21.1mph which puts it in the category of no further action at this time.

4. **Guest Matthew Grove Police & Crime Commissioner: PC Proud** was also in attendance and read out the crime figures for Barnetby which did not show an increase however it's a different story in Brigg with a sharp increase. The PCC advised that there had been issues with the 101 number service with people waiting an unacceptable length of time for calls and visits. The brief given to the Chief Constable was to redesign policing but that they must protect neighbourhood services which has not been the result. PCC accepted that local intelligence and Police presence is essential in the rural areas and that they are working on addressing this issue and he apologised for the current situation. There are however a lot of positives about the new model which include no more luxury vehicles for Chief officers, a considerable saving with Officers being able to make their reports on iPad rather than travelling back to base. The closure of the mounted horse division which was costing £500k per year has been replaced with bringing in when required at a cost of £5k per annum. The Brigg Police Station has not been closed it is now a station that deals with children and families who are victims of crime
5. **Cemetery Clerk:** Jenny Pitt advised the Council the hedge cutting is being done but not yet complete and the fence needs painting **Resolved:** Jenny to acquire 3 quotes. The possibility of having water on site was discussed and the clerk will look into this. Finally a rubbish bin needs siting at the cemetery for dead flowers
